Midland College Syllabus EMSP 1160 EMT Clinical (0-0-4)

Course Description

A health-related work-based learning experience that enables the student to apply specialized occupational theory, skills and concepts. Direct supervision is provided by the clinical professional. Prerequisite: Admission to the program.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will:

- 1. Apply the theory, concepts, and skills involving specialized materials, tools, equipment, procedures, regulations, laws, and interactions within and among political, economic, environmental, social, and legal systems associated with the occupation and the business/industry.
- 2. Demonstrate legal and ethical behavior, safety practices, interpersonal and teamwork skills, and appropriate written and verbal communication skills using the terminology of the occupation and the business.

Student Contributions, Responsibilities and Class Policies

- 1. Students will be expected to attend all classes. Class will start promptly at the designated time. Any student arriving late will be counted tardy.
- 2. It is the sole responsibility of the student to make-up missed assignments due to absence. Make-up assignments must be completed within the time limit set by the instructor.
- 3. Three tardies will result in one (1) absence. If a student exceeds one (2) absence during the semester, they will be dropped from the program.
- 4. Students will be **required** to wear uniforms for all program related activities (class, ambulance internships, clinical rotations, and as requested by the instructor). The uniform includes shirt, pants

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and footwear as outlined in the EMT Student Handbook. The student must purchase a uniform t-shirt that **must** be worn while in class and during ambulance internships. *All students must* have their uniforms for class prior to the second Tuesday of the semester, any student not wearing the uniform will be sent home.

5. All required vaccinations, CPR certificate, copies of insurance and other requirements for starting the clinical rotation **must be completed** and documentation submitted to **Randall Heredia** no later than the 4th Tuesday of the semester.

Evaluation of Students

Individual clinical rotations will be assigned grades and then averaged to determine the final grade. Students must receive a final grade of 75% or better to receive a course completion and be eligible to sit for the credentialing exam. Students must complete all required clinicals as required by the EMT Clinical Handbook for the semester.

Grades will be assigned as follows:

A = 90 - 100% B = 80 - 89% C = 75 - 79% D = 60 - 74% F = 59 and below
